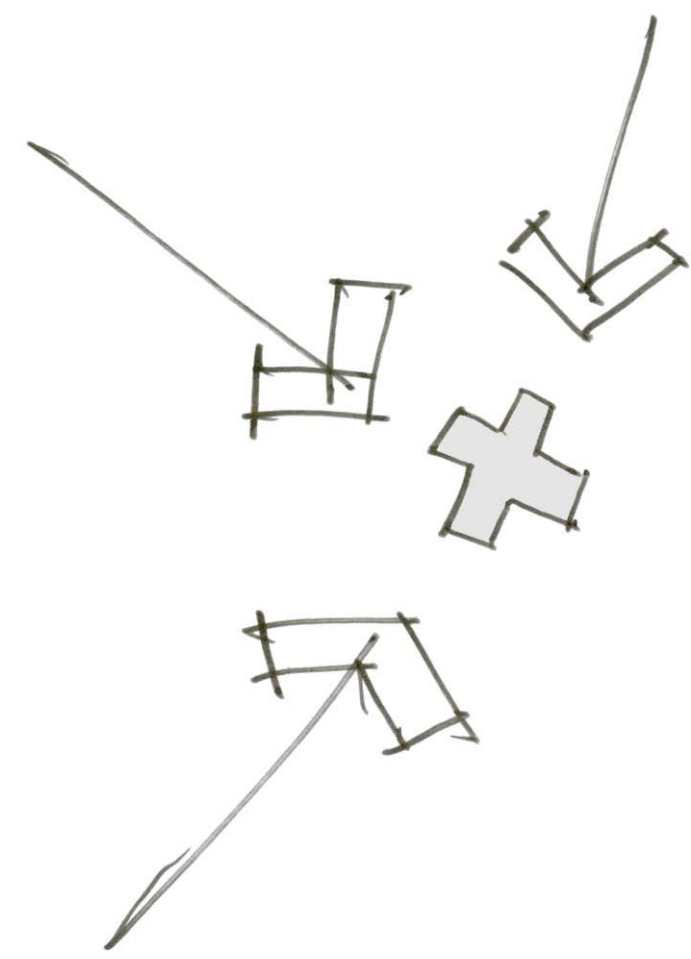


Preparation: Snow

Quality snow is a key to a good quality snowman. Find snow that sticks together when you grab a hand full.



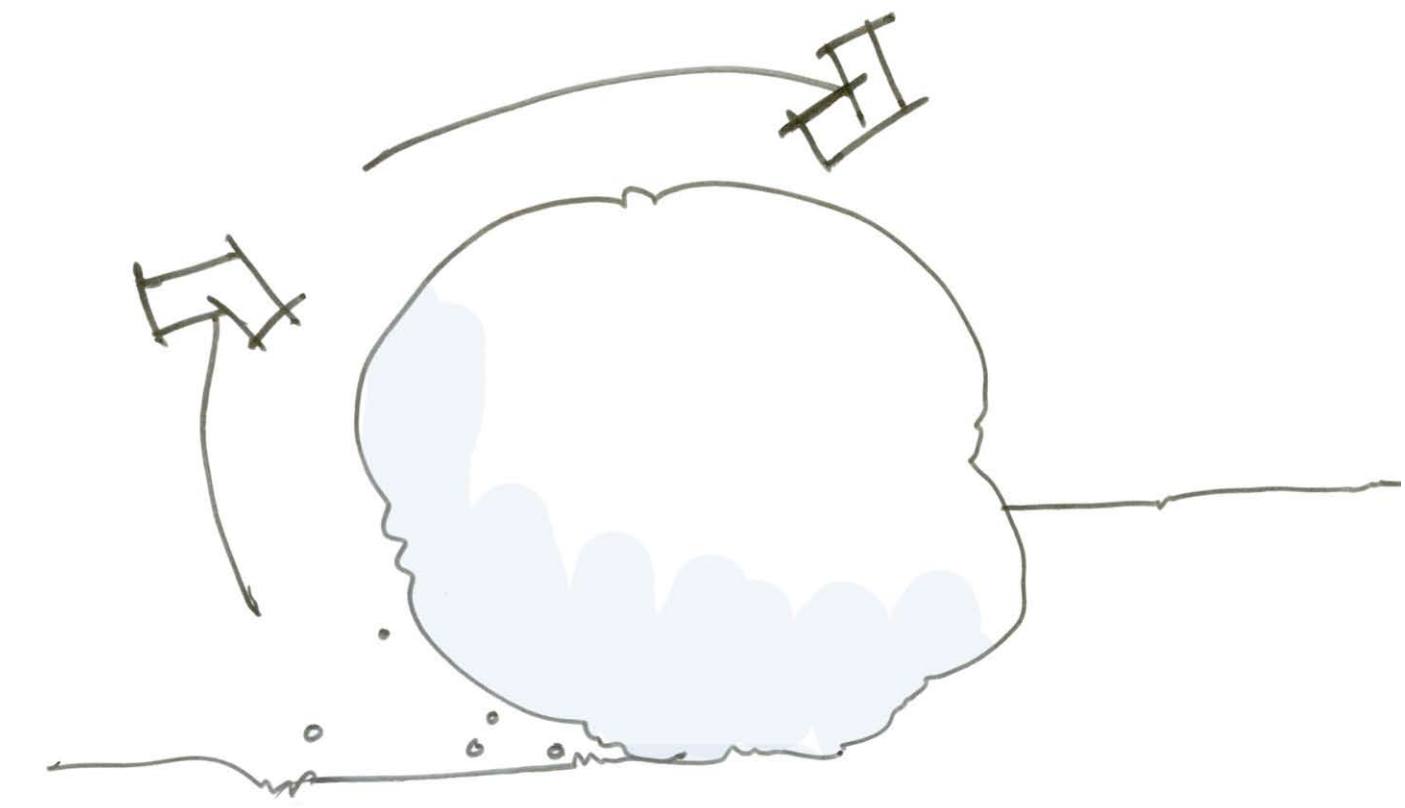
Preparation: Location

You want to maximize visibility with your snowman. Find a location where all the neighbors can gawk in jealousy, but is flat enough to supply you with enough snow with the least amount of work.



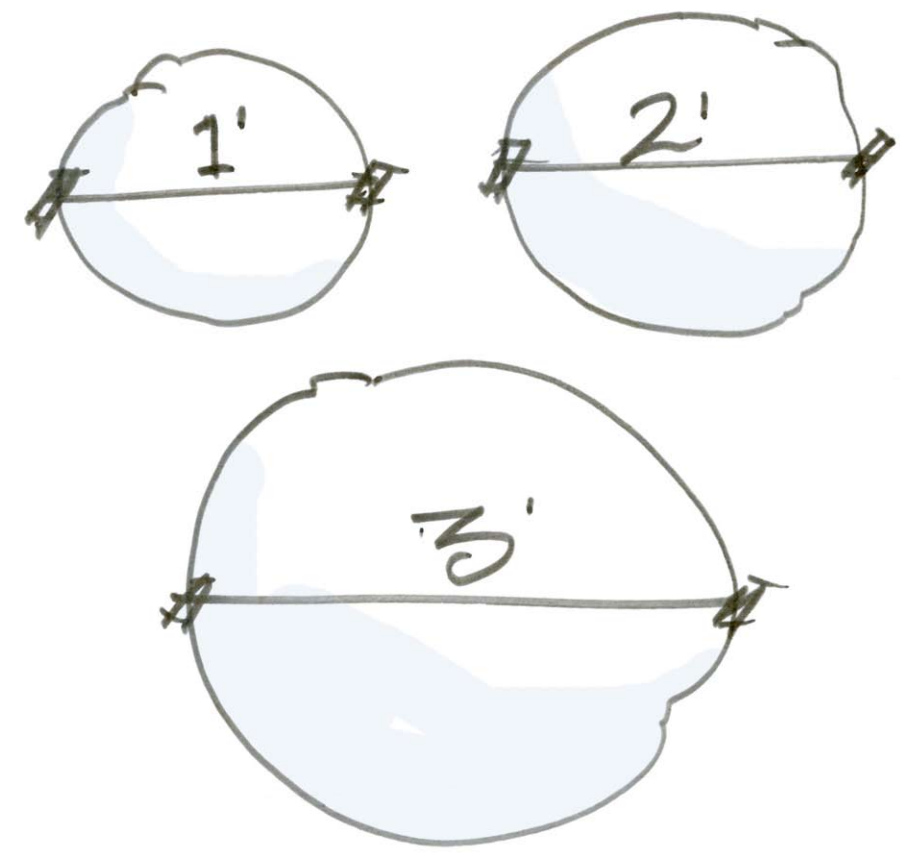
Step 1

Standing about 10 feet away from the snowman's location, pack a handful of snow into a ball. Set the ball on the snow on the ground and carefully roll it, making sure that it completes full rotations without dragging.



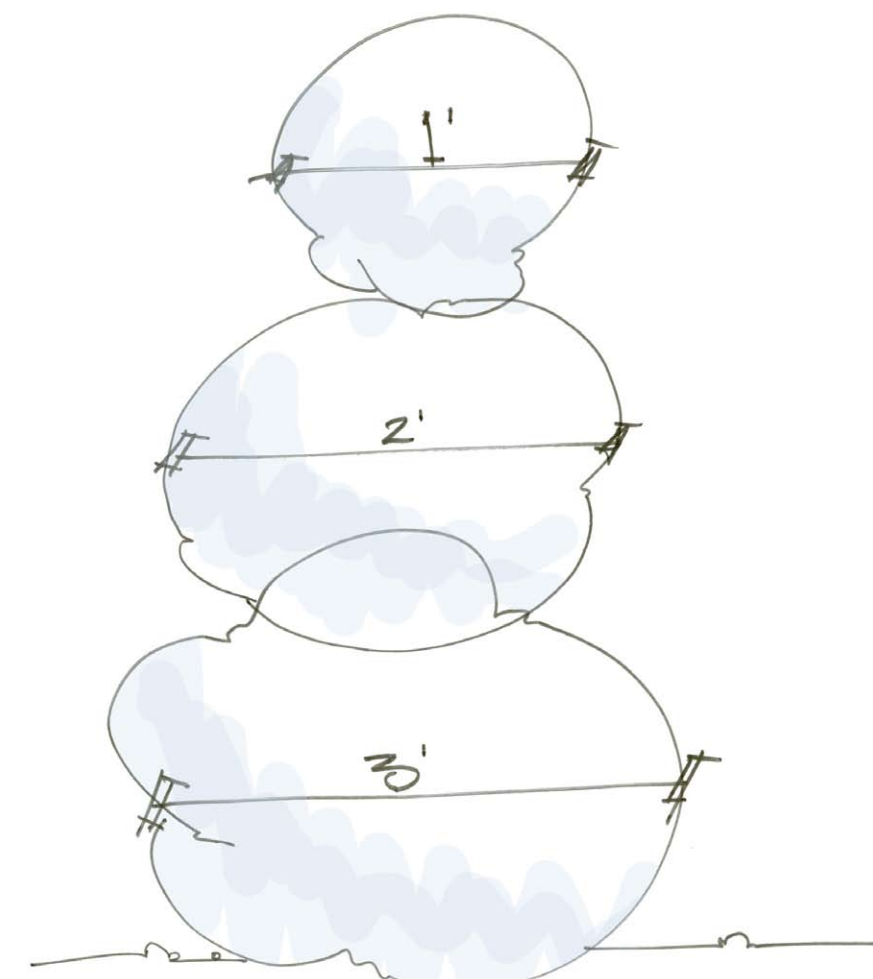
Step 2

If the ball is rolled properly and patiently, the way proper snowman technicians do, it will collect snow along its way and increase in size. As the ball gets bigger, it's weight will press against the snow on the ground and aid in accumulating more snow.



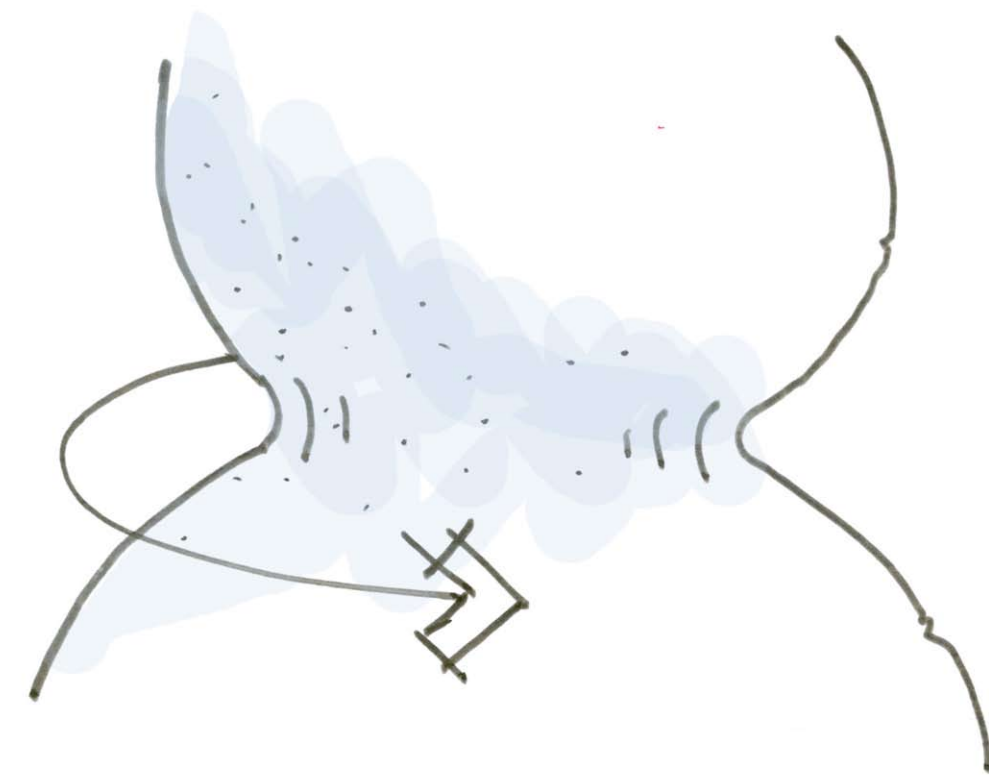
Step 3

Make three large snow balls with a variety of sizes. We suggest as shown, with a 3 foot, 2 foot and 1 foot ball. You may dare to create larger snowmen as your snowman technician skills improve.



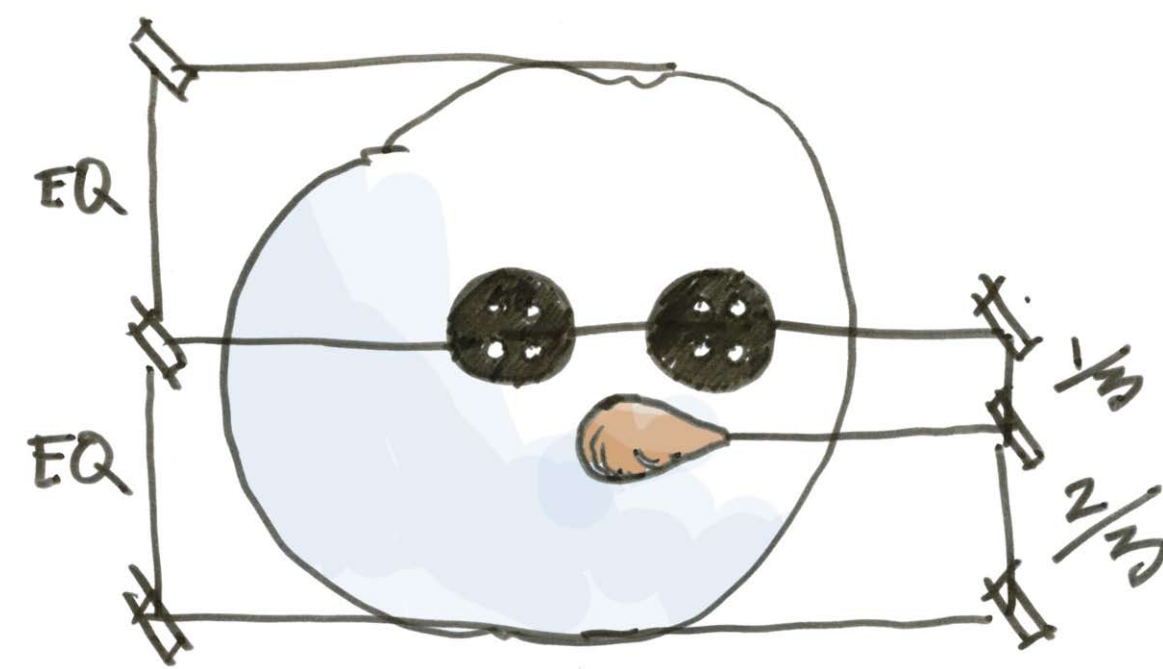
Step 4

Stack the balls in a vertical position. The largest of the three balls should be on the bottom, making sure that it is stable. A quality foundation is key to a structurally strong snowman.



Step 5

With the palm of your glove, gently pat and smooth the points of contact between balls, ensuring that the snowman will be able to withstand strong winter winds.



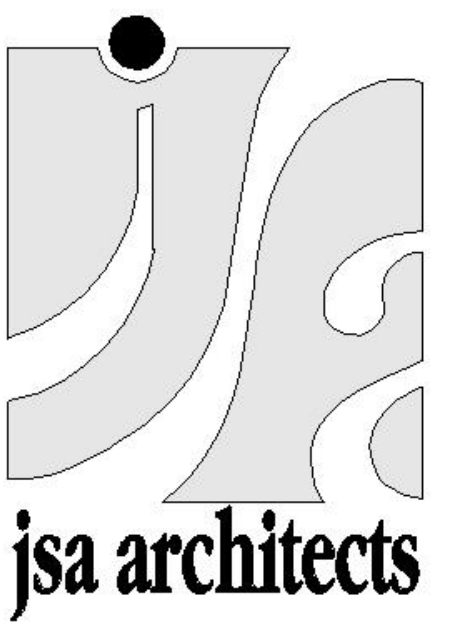
Step 5

After years and millions of dollars in research, scientists have finally figured out the formula to the most handsome snowman face. Place buttons in the center of the topmost ball, with equal distance between the top and bottom. Add a carrot one third of the way down between the eyes, and the bottom of the topmost ball.

Step 5

The snowman is ready for it's final touches. Place a hat on top to keep his head protected from rouge snowballs from nearby snowball fights. Place a scarf around his neck so that he will blend in with anyone who walks by. Add two top quality hand selected aspen branches on each side to simulate arms.

Congratulations, you are now a snowman technician!
